This church season we have entered is not what I call a holiday season. However, like Advent, Lent is a time of active waiting. Beginning on Feb. 17<sup>th</sup>, Ash Wednesday, Lent is the church season when we mark and replicate in ways unique to each of us, Jesus' 40 days of sacrifice and isolation in the wilderness. In this “wild place,” Jesus daily faced tempting offers to remove himself from the torment he was experiencing. Yet, Jesus said no. He knew that too much would be lost.

As we enter this season of Lent, I am reminded of all that we have lost as a community – of all the gatherings, celebrations, fun and life we should have shared since this time a year ago. In some ways, we have been in a wilderness far more than 40 days. Since arriving to serve with you only 8 months ago, I feel like I have been exiled from my community, cast out from the worship and fellowship opportunities I adore, from meeting members and friends at a restaurant, or talking unveiled to my neighbor. I have faced temptations in this exilic time; so, have you. But while we are still not fully face to face, our live-stream worship, radio ministry, phone calls, zoom Bible study and meetings have served like a balm in Gilead or a loaf of bread in the desert. And yet, even these things are not enough to sustain me in the wilderness.

Lent is a 40-day season (not counting Sundays) marked by repentance, fasting, and reflection. It is a time of deep, and a sometimes vulnerable and soul-wrenching search for God. There are days I feel as if God is on the dark side of the moon, nowhere to be seen or heard from. But, deep in my sometimes-wrenched soul, I know that is not true. I know that God is actively with me, is with us, and is actively working in the lives of every creature who will offer welcome. I know this because at the end of this 40-day season is the ultimate celebration, a celebration of life. The best news is that, unlike Mary and the first disciples, we do not have to wait to live into the ultimate celebration. Jesus is alive right now and is with us in our wild places, our places of exile, and places of deafening solitude or loneliness.

This year, as I continue the season of Lent, I will remember what we have all suffered and endured, but I will also take with me the blessings of virtual worship and living, and the truth that no matter the circumstances, Christ is alive and present with us, now. Jesus Christ is to be celebrated now for overcoming his temptations so that in the end, we too will celebrate with each other and all the saints in heaven who trod the Lenten Seasons of life to the ultimate celebration in the holy presence of the Living God.

May you move through this season of Lent in the assurance of God's loving presence with you, too.

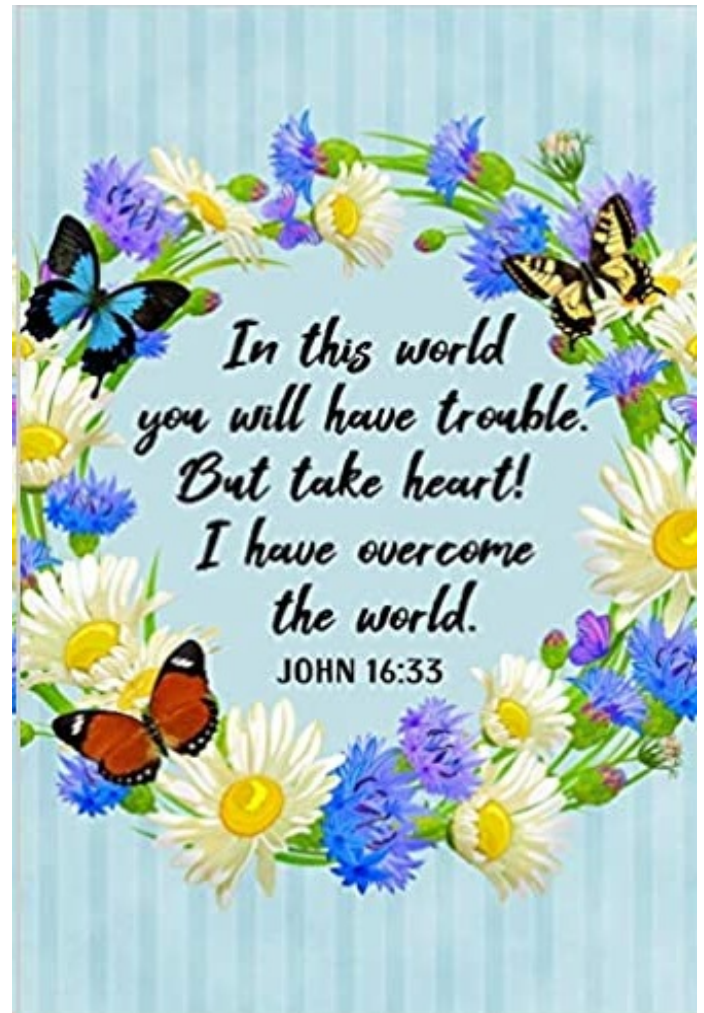
