The people who walk in darkness will see a great light – a light that will shine on all who live in the land where death casts its shadow. – Isaiah 9:2

Reflecting over the past 26 years of pastoral ministry, I started thinking that I need to do things differently this year. Over the past couple of years Christmas has seemed to me to be a short breather between times of great busy-ness. It has become little more than a holiday speed bump.

I long for the days when the anticipation of Christmas Eve, Christmas Day, and the 12 Days of Christmas were almost palpable. So, I am thinking this year I am going to do things differently. I am going to focus more on our present season of Advent – the time of preparation.

The Isaiah verse above reminds us that this world can cast a shadow of death on our lives if we get too caught up in it. When we spend too much time grinding at work to the neglect of our families, the shadow of death looms over us. What is going on in your life that is blocking the Light that is inbreaking your darkness?

A time of preparation is key to being able to fully embrace an event of great significance. The Lord says, “Shout and rejoice, O Jerusalem, for I am coming to live among you.” (Zechariah 2:10) Surely you will agree that is an event of utmost significance! So, beginning with this present moment of Advent, I hope you will join me in preparing to make this Christmas a most joyous one by readying your family and your life for the Christ.

FINANCE REPORT

Good news from the finance committee! After trailing last year's pace of giving by \$13,000, offerings are now \$4,054 ahead of last year. Thank you so much for your response during these difficult times. Our in person attendance has stabilized at 47. This is a few more than half our normal attendance. I hope many of you are taking advantage of the YouTube broadcast of our Sunday morning services. Several non-members have told me they are tuning in and are blessed by the service. Thanks to our soundboard team who are learning new video broadcast skills.

Our new online giving program is up and running with some initial activity. You can access the program several ways, including through our website wumc@whitevillumc.org. Pastor Terry is our 'go to guy' and can help with any questions you may have. Many thanks to him for introducing us to this program and managing the implementation.

The annual pledge campaign has evolved over the years from primarily a member to member canvas to increase pledges, to a system for encouraging and tracking pledges. The 2021 campaign resulted in 25 pledges totaling \$135,828. Both number and amount are 14% less than last year. Thanks to Kevin Bullard and Pastor Terry for their leadership of the campaign.

We likely will not raise our full budget this year, but the pandemic and other issues reduced our budgeted expenditures. Current offerings are covering our expenses. The 2021 budget has been approved and copies will be available soon. It is very similar to last year, but with a 3% reduction. It is a challenging budget in these uncertain times but we move forward in faith. Application has been made for forgiveness of the SBA Payroll Protection Program loan. If forgiven it will provide a cushion for the remainder of this year and into next.

Please stay safe and trust that with God's guidance we will soon be able to resume our full worship, fellowship, and ministries.

Contributions can now be debited automatically from your checking or savings account or processed using your credit or debit card. Our new electronic giving program offers convenience for you and provides much-needed donation consistency for our congregation.

If you are currently giving on a weekly basis through writing or automatically sending checks, we encourage you to continue your method of giving.

When travel, illness or other circumstances prevent you from attending services or giving in your usual manner this program will allow your weekly offerings to continue on an uninterrupted basis. This will also give family and friends who live in other areas of the country, who watch online, or listen to our radio ministry, the opportunity to give on a regular basis or special occasion such as giving to a memorial or food pantry.

You can give online or through text-to-give option using your cell phone. Begin by visiting the church website: whitevilleumc.org. Just click on the "Donate" button that is found at the top right corner of the home page. Select the option you would like to do and follow simple directions. Either option allows you to make donations to the church as a one-time gift or recurring gift.
