OUTREACH

We all are part of personal giving with our prayers, words of encouragement and hope, and joyous actions at this difficult time. On behalf of this church community, financial support has been given this year to:

Families First - \$500 of \$2000 budget

Missionary salary support - \$1800 for Vickie Sigmon, Community Service in Winston-Salem and \$1800 for Mozart Adevu for his work on Sustainable Agriculture with local communities in western Africa.

Rise Against Hunger - \$1000 budgeted for meal packaging event (postponed indefinitely) was sent to be used toward transportation of medical supplies where needed around the world

When it is possible for Selma Adevu to resume her medical school training, the clinical studies are on hold, we will contribute \$1000 toward her tuition.

We support other local groups and will do so with Pridgen Endowment funds designated for local missions but not shown as part of the church budget.

Our congregation continues to “pay it forward” by supporting local, national and global efforts to show the light and love of Jesus.

FINANCE REPORT

Good news, we received the SBA forgivable Payroll Protection Program loan proceeds of \$25,690 on July 15th. The loan will be forgiven after eight weeks if we meet the terms and conditions.

For the first half of this unusual pandemic shutdown year we have done relatively well financially. As of June 30th, our general fund offerings were \$131,848 and our expenses were \$138,086. The \$6,238 shortage was funded from our reserves. We have maintained a \$23,000 reserve balance for several years as a rainy day balance. Expenses included our annual insurance premiums of \$15,974. We did however stop paying apportionments and outreach donations at the end of March. Our offerings to-date are \$8,911 less than last June 30th. Many thanks to our committees for limiting expenses during these trying times.

At mid-year we are \$22,756 behind our budget. The SBA loan will catch us up. The committee will begin working on next year’s budget in August. We will also discuss resuming apportionment payments and outreach mission donations.

We are blessed to have two volunteers, Olive Shuping and Dick Simms, who are handling our treasurer’s duties during Tammie Anderson’s emergency family medical leave.

Worship service attendance has not been taken during the pandemic shutdown.

Thank you for your continuing financial support during these trying times.

Please stay safe and trust that God will meet all our needs if we are faithful.
